Cllr Hendon confirmed that he had completed B&DBC Register of Members Interests and sent it through to the monitoring officer at Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council.

Cllr Mahoney reminded all Councillors of their responsibility to keep their Register of Members Interest are kept up to date.

Cllr Lovett explained that the Community Association had offered to make a contribution of £25 per head towards a meal on 4 January 2018, venue to be confirmed.

Dignity at Work policy to be reviewed & brought for agreement in a future Parish Council Meeting Grit Bins – Cllr Lovett is still to undertake a review of the grit bins across the site.

Borough Councillor

Verbal update provided.

<u>Skate Park</u> – Approval has been received from Environmental Health for the acoustic fence, so Planning Department are expecting to be able to recommend approval as there are no other outstanding issues. £12637 for play equipment is to apportioned to the Skate Part

<u>Manydown</u> – a new project manager has been appointed, so expecting the project to move forwards. Further consultation events expected to take place end of Q1 2018.

<u>BARN / RETAIL UNITS / THE MAIN HALL</u> - Everything as now reverted back to Plan A, as Galamast were not wanting us to let us have a legal agreement to spec for what was needed to be included in the Barn, not wanting to put in to the legal agreement that we could survey the Barn, not wanting to put in to the legal agreement about warranties for the Barn.

Not had a discussion yet about what should be included in the lease on the Main Hall. All the conversations have been about the freehold of the barn. Requested the bills through at this point so that all parties know the costs for getting to Plan B, before starting the process to revert back to Plan A.

Community Association is looking to see if it can negotiate some s106 monies for getting the leases for the retail units directly from Taylor Wimpey. There will be no legal surprises with this commercial negotiation. Taylor Wimpey confirm market value of £220k for each unit.

<u>Yellow / Parking Lines</u> – should be going in this week. Plan to launch with the Children & their parents next week.

Everest School - has a new Head teacher

<u>GP surgery</u> practice manager has now left and if you read local newspapers you will see there is campaign to get the Secretary of State to get IMH and Cedarwood out of Beggarwood and Rooksdown.

<u>School Expansion meeting</u> – 1 November at the Community Centre.

106 monies – public art projects – monies from Harness Court – Hanging Bat in the trees in Crondall Terrace. PPN – large metal orchid or white holdbroreen ... expecting that to appear in DWH Spinney.

TRO to extend the 20mph limit to Barron Place, Florence Way, Gander Drive, Gillies Drive & Nightingale Gardens

HCC have confirmed that the process to extend the 20 mph limit to Barron Place, Florence Way etc is expected to be completed in early 2018.

The existing 20mph signs on posts after the walled entry off A339 will be removed and placed at the walled entry location to show the boundary of the speed limit.

I am currently looking to arrange a meeting with the Traffic Management Engineer at HCC – likely to be early December, to discuss the options for the walled entrance to Rooksdown from A339 and will report to a future Parish Council meeting.

Full data results are attached as Appendix 1 – which essentially are 'heat maps' showing vehicles travelling 24mph+

The data is very rich & clearly evidences that Speeding is still a significant issue in Rooksdown and there is a massive risk at school start and finish times.

I have shared the data with HCC who are obviously concerned about child safety given some of the speeds recorded at both locations used to collect the data.

I am currently working with the Principle Engineer, Traffic Management at HCC about how they can support to influence the Police to attend to undertake enforcement. The 2 months data will be useful to determine the times that they could attend.

We are also discussing the options with regard the speed bumps which are wholly unsuitable for the purpose.


Castle Hill Primary School - meeting in October

HCC Budget Challenges

On top of cuts already imposed/implemented, the County now has to find a further £140 million savings from across all council budget areas. This requirement will clearly have significant impacts on services in BDBC Divisions. The detail will be presented, debated by & voted on @ Full Council on Thursday 2nd November. Thereafter I will have a better view to give to RPC at a later date.

HCC Committees

As you know, all HCC Cllrs served on council committees. I am a member of:

Children & Young People Select Committee & Children & Families Advisory Committee

Manydown

Planning progress continues...with the lead from BDBC as the primary planning/decision making authority.

Along with a good number of Borough Councillors, County Councillors, Borough Officers, we recently visited 2 "Exemplar" housing developments in other southern regions to gain not just a view of potential quality of build but also proposals for the kind of Manydown development BDBC/HCC might want to see in this controversial & preciously guarded major/permanent change to our community...affecting principally Winklebury & north west Basingstoke but of course the whole of this Hampshire locality.

The final decision obviously rests with BDBC. I was personally impressed with the exemplar site as developed on the redundant RAF site near Weston Super Mare/Bristol...not only the actual housing layout on the site, build quality but also the ethics & corporate principles as espoused by the senior development executives presentations on the day.

Castle Hill School & HCC

As RPC knows full well, this has been an ongoing issue for quite some time...in fact since the building/siting of the school & especially the planned for expansion of intake, site & problematic safe access/egress issues.

Fruitful negotiations & collective debate has taken place between the School, RPC, BDBC & HCC that has latterly resulted in a position that captures the needs & safety aspirations of all relevant bodies/interested parties. I am confident that we have now arrived at a position that successfully & realistically addresses the needs & views of all interested parties. I look forward to solid progress that will reach the agreed outcome in a timely manner.

Saxonwood School

I have donated £1,000 from my HCC CIIr Grant to fund the purchase of a number of Tablets...seen by the Head of the School as critical to maximising learning outcomes for children with severe & profound learning disabilities.

Fort Hill School Closure

Clearly a number of Rooksdown parents & students are directly affected by HCC's decision to close the school... as they fell within its catchment area. I am seeking approval from the Executive Member HCC for financial support to facilitate After School activities by financing transport. This is in addition to the transitional funding

already dedicated to getting Fort Hill School students to Cranbourne College. Depending on this outcome, I will consider making a contribution from my HCC ClIr Grant. I have already donated £500 from my ClIr Grant to help enable their 2018 School Prom...at the request from the current Head Girl. This would effectively be the last Prom of this school & is therefore especially poignant & significant in terms of memories.

Casework/Specific Local Issues

I have had a number of residents issues brought to me: Bus Passes/ Parking problems etc. I am in the process of addressing them with the relevant HCC officers & I am finding the HCC officers very responsive & positive in terms of interest in resolving them.

Basingstoke Hospital (Firs Unit)

Last week, I officially attended the formal opening of the unique to Hampshire re-ablement unit ... "Firs" @ Basingstoke Hospital. This is a joint HCC/NHS "trail blazing "project (it is the first of its kind in Hampshire) that leads the way in terms of enabling the successful & timely transition of In - Patients to their home + those who don't really need to actually be on a hospital ward but have physical care needs following a trauma of some kind. This not only unblocks ward beds in a dynamic "rapid turn around" way but is also a creative use of expensive NHS resources that are under pressure & seeks very creative outcomes for elderly residents. As this is located in the BDBC ward of Rooksdown, I see this as an initiative/service that RPC can be very proud of.

I have the honour of being Father Christmas on 2 occasions @ the Rooksdown Community Centre: Children's Xmas Party, Saturday 10th December & @ a Community Drop In event, Saturday 25th November.
