#### ROOKSDOWN PARISH COUNCIL Charles Miller—Chairman

Rooksdown Parish Council meets monthly (except August and December) in the main hall at Saxon Wood School; please come along and raise anything which concerns you about Rooksdown. A notice of each meeting will be displayed on the notice boards throughout the parish, and dates of forthcoming meetings will also be found on the council's website, www.rooksdown.org.uk, along with minutes of past meetings and other local information.

Following problems reported by a number of residents in the newer areas of the estate, particularly concerning street lighting and the state of roads and pavements, members of the Parish Council have attended a number of meetings with the Developers to ensure that they have an awareness of the problems which residents are experiencing. We are hopeful that this will lead to swifter resolution, although sometimes there are reasons why it is not possible to do this as fast as we would like. For faulty street lights and road problems in adopted roads contact the County Council via www.hants.gov.uk

The owners of the land near Nightingale Gardens, which is used as a football kickabout area, have granted the Parish Council a temporary lease so that it can continue to be used for recreation until it is required for development – the council will arrange for repairs to the pitch surface and adjacent fencing. We are hopeful that the large open space at the hospital end of Rooksdown (near the site of the proposed community centre) will be released by the Summer – a number of steps have to happen first but if all goes well the "Village Green" will become available for informal recreational use.

The seats for the green by the Mill Road roundabout will be installed as soon as consultation with residents in the immediate area has been completed. It is our intention to purchase seats for other areas of the estate in the future; if you would like to suggest a location where you feel a seat would be useful, please contact the Parish Clerk.

The council continues to investigate the possibility of the provision of allotments within Rooksdown – at present there is no land available but we intend to push for the inclusion of allotment land as part of any further development within the estate.

#### Cllr Karen Cherrett, Rooksdown Borough Councillor

I am often asked the same questions by different people about the things that concern them most. As a result I thought I'd give you an update on the top ten most frequently asked questions for the last few months:

#### What's happening with the street lights in Limes Park?

Taylor Wimpey confirms that the trenches have been dug in preparation for the power supplier to come and do the necessary connections. Some lighting is connected but the continuing delay is with the power suppliers (who were originally meant to start back in October). We are all chasing a solution.

• When will we expect to see shops and a community building? We are continuing to talk to the developers who disagree with the council, parish and community about the financial viability of shops on the development. We say there is demand and that it's economically viable now but we cannot make the developers build the building. I will keep you posted. As for the community centre, we have got planning permission and look forward to starting to build it this year.

#### When will we get a park for older children?

Early release of the land at the old hospital cricket pavilion site by developers is being discussed and we hope that it will brought forward to this year to coincide with the start of preparing land for the community centre.

#### Where will the community centre be?

On the land between the temporary Rooksdown surgery and the green (old hospital pavilion) where the helicopter lands. The green itself is the land we want released as a village green and play space.

• What about the big puddle that forms on Rooksdown Avenue? This has been a recurring headache with different solutions being tried so far. A solution (putting an additional pipe under the road and deeper soakaways) has been put forward and is on the highways schedule for this year. We hope this will solve the problem.

#### When will we get a more frequent bus service?

We are currently told by bus operators that Rooksdown is not viable for a more frequent or direct to town service. This is partly because of the size of development and partly because of the different ownership of the roads – roads in the older part of the area are adopted and the responsibility of the Highways Authority, but roads in the newer areas of Limes Park are still privately owned by the developers and the hospital. This will change as the development is progressed and demand increases. Until then we will keep lobbying for a better service.

#### Cllr Karen Cherrett, Rooksdown Borough Councillor

#### When will the roads and pavements be finished?

Until roads and pavements are completed and handed over by developers for adoption by the County Council, there is little power to enforce any maintenance. However we are in discussions with the developers about phased adoptions, some as early as this year, so that we don't have to wait for everything to be completed. Site completion could still be 3-5 years away.

#### Why do some of us pay a management charge?

When the Rooksdown development was less than half built, the government introduced an initiative to collect funds from households on new developments to pay for a residents' management committee. The committee would look after greens and open spaces in the area. The charge only applies to Limes Park and seems to split the maintenance of the estate in two. This doesn't seem to make sense as we already have a Parish Council and Community Association - so we are trying to get all of the area brought under one responsible organisation. Until then, monies already paid are being held in a legal trust by solicitors.

#### Will Rooksdown get any bigger?

There are areas still to be developed at Rooksdown to complete the originally planned development: land at the old golf course, Aldermaston Triangle (between the A340 and the hospital) and Trumpet Junction (next to Priestly Road) are still earmarked for development. For these areas it is not a question of whether but when development will occur and the Parish Councillors and I will want to know your views through the coming consultations on what sort of development we want to see on this land.

And finally a topical winter question:

#### Should I clear my path when it snows and where can I get grit?

Homeowners have a duty of care over their premises including safe access to it by visitors. In deciding whether to clear snow or ice the view seems to be that to do so with good intent is fine as long as in doing so you do not make the area more dangerous e.g. using a kettle of hot water on a frozen path will just create a sheet of ice. Anyone wishing to make a claim for damages if they slip has to demonstrate the actions of the householder were negligent and directly contributed to the fall. Ultimately it comes down to using your own neighbourly judgement and common sense. As for grit, rock salt is available from most DIY warehouses although we are lobbying the County Council for grit bins in the area and if this fails the Parish Council may well look to buy and place some.

#### SALT/GRIT BINS IN ROOKSDOWN

Following input from residents and Parish Councillors a list of locations have been submitted to the Borough Council via Maria Miller MP in the hope we can get some grit bins provided. Whilst it is unlikely Hampshire County Council and BDBC will provide them for all our suggested locations, Rooksdown Parish Council (RPC) has resolved to put funds towards those we cannot get through other means. These will be ordered once we know which ones will be funded elsewhere. HCC will however be responsible for filling them. It must be emphasised that the grit is for residents to use on the roads and pavements and not for private use.

However in the meantime RPC does have stored with some Parish Councillors very restricted quantities of grit and sand for emergency use in the event of more bad weather. Please contact the Parish Clerk (details on our website or in this magazine) with details as to the location with problems and he will contact the Councillors who are storing the grit/sand.

We do urge residents to continue to help and support each other during the bad weather and getting together to clear your local vicinity is a great way to get to know your neighbours as happened in some areas of Rooksdown.

If you are forced to abandon your car please do so in a safe location and not at road junctions or roundabouts where anyone skidding is likely to cause damage to their own vehicle and yours. Finally please remove it at your earliest possibility so that road clearing efforts can be undertaken without hindrance.





#### **COMMUNITY SAFETY PATROL TEAMS**

New Community Safety Patrols hit the streets of the Borough on Friday 12 February. The team will work closely with the community to identify and tackle issues reducing crime, deterring anti-social behaviour to make residents feel safer and happier about their neighbourhood.

They will be working closely with the Police with daily combined meetings. The CSPO can tackle offenses such as graffiti, littering, dog fouling and confiscating alcohol from underage drinkers.

#### **Stay Safe On The Roads.**

#### Don't drive tired -

Plan in a 15 min rest break for every 2hrs of driving.

Avoid making long trips between midnight- 6am and 2-4pm when natural alertness is low.

Share the driving if possible.

#### Don't drink drive -

Nearly one in six of all deaths on the road involve drivers who are over the legal alcohol limit.

The only safe option is not to drink any alcohol if you plan to drive and never offer an alcoholic drink to anyone else who is driving.

Driving whilst above the legal limit or unfit through drink carries a maximum penalty of 6 months' imprisonment, a fine of up to £5,000 and a minimum 12 months driving ban.

#### Don't use your mobile phone while driving -

On 27 Feb 2007, the £30 fine was increased to £60 and three penalty points on your licence. Penalty points = higher insurance costs.

If you get six points within two years of passing your test, your licence will be revoked and you will need to re-sit the test.

If the case goes to court, you could risk a maximum fine of £1,000, which rises to £2,500 for the driver of a bus, coach, or heavy goods vehicle.

#### Always buckle up -

Drivers and front seat passengers in cars must wear a seat belt, unless they have a medical exemption certificate.

Children under the age of 14, travelling in the rear of a car that has appropriate restraints, must belt up.

Adults travelling in the rear of a car must also use seat belts, it is the responsibility of the adult passenger (not the driver) to ensure that they are using the seat belt.



#### NICKY'S BANANA BRIOCHE PUDDING By Nicky Young

#### Ingredients

1 x large Brioche Loaf
4 x small bananas or 3 x large
200g Plain Chocolate
8 Tablespoons of Baileys (you can buy miniatures bottles)
570 ml sour cream (2 x 1/2 pint tubs)
4 eggs

- Slice the loaf and cut into small squares using a sharp knife, put half of these into the bottom of an oven proof dish with sides about 25-30cm in diameter.
- Slice the bananas and put half on top of the brioche.
- Roughly chop the chocolate using a chopper if you have one, sprinkle half of the chocolate over the bananas and repeat in layers until all the brioche banana and chocolate are in the dish.
- Whisk together the 4 eggs, then add the sour cream and Baileys and mix well.
- Pour over the pudding and gently ease down so that it reaches the bottom layers. Leave to soak for 10 minutes before putting into the oven.
- Bake in the oven on 180 C for about 20-25 minutes until golden brown.

This is a lovely pudding if you have family or friends round, and takes minutes to put together. Its even better if it cooked in a Pampered Chef stone dish, but any ovenproof dish will do.
