

Since the beginning of the year we have been holdingour monthly Parish Council meetings at the new Rooksdown Community Centre.

If you have anything you wish to bring to the attention of the Parish Council, or our Borough and County Councillors and the police beat officer who also attend the meetings, please come along on the 4th Monday of the month.

The council is happy to have been able to provide funds to both the Community Association and the Scouts to assist with setting up much needed community facilities in the new centre.

Among the items which are being progressed are work to retain the car parks on Peggs Way, the installation of some form of restriction to Rooksdown Avenue near the junction with Peggs Way (to allow the passage of buses and emergency vehicles only), parking problems throughout the parish, and monitoring the working hours of the developers to reduce the disturbance to residents.

The council (along with the Rooksdown Community Association) are in discussions with David Wilson Homes, the chosen developers of the old golf course site, to provide community input to the planning of the new phase of the development; it is to be hoped that this way we can avoid repeating the mistakes of the past.

In collaboration with the community association, we are arranging a "party in the park" for Saturday 2nd June as our celebration of the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen, including a picnic in the afternoon, a disco in the evening and culminating with a short firework display. We hope to see you all there.

PRIMARY SCHOOL PROJECT ALIVE AND KICKING!

Deferring our application for a primary school was a difficult decision to take in February, and we know many parents were disappointed, but it was definitely the right one. The project team had only been working together for 7 weeks and could not get enough parents of children of the right age to complete the parent questionnaire by the deadline. Now the team have until February 2013 to put together an application that the Department for Education will find very hard to refuse.

The school already has the support of the Parish Council, our Basingstoke and Deane Councillor, Karen Cherrett, our MP, Maria Miller, many Rooksdown residents and businesses as well as residents from neighbouring parishes. However, last month we had a very positive meeting with a representative from the strategic school places team for Hampshire County Council. It was a positive meeting where they confirmed that Rooksdown, Merton Rise and Marnell Park is the school place planning hotspot for Basingstoke. The dialogue continues but HCC is now generally supportive of a new school in Rooksdown.

With this great news there is still much to do. So how can you help?

Everyone can sign the community petition showing support for having a school in Rooksdown. Evidence shows that having an outstanding school in your community increases property prices – so everyone wins!

Also, if you

- are a parent of a child of primary school age or under complete our parent questionnaire
- are a teacher join our working group and help develop our education plan and policies
- \bullet work in finance or accounting join our working group and put together the schools finances
- work in HR, recruitment, web development, education law, are a building surveyor, architect or project manager help us develop these areas of our application

Help man the school's stall at the Jubilee celebrations and the 'Festival of Games' event this summer. Or if you can give a few hours in June or July, work in pairs to go "door to door" asking people to sign the petition or complete a parent questionnaire

This is an exciting time for the project now that everyone is behind delivering a school in Rooksdown.
