PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Dear residents...

It is has been a frustrating month with regards some of the big ticket items.

Traffic Management Works - At the stakeholders meeting everything was, we thought, signed off and the Taylor Wimpey were given the OK to submit the application for the following day.

However post meeting we were then informed that for B&DBC Chief Planning officer had decided to request a tree survey be undertaken on the two trees that need to be removed to allow the Avenue to fit correctly to the new lodge junction plans. This is being progressed. Taylor Wimpy wish to do the phase one works this summer. As soon as we have an application number then we will let residents know.

Old Hall - The planning application for this was meant to have been decided by 10th February according to the B&DBC web site. With no news available on line we have duly followed up only to be advised that the Case Officer is now working through the S106 requirements. This is extremely frustrating especially when the advised date for a decision was early February. We continue to chase hard.

Change of use of pavilions to create parking and associated landscaping – planning application 13/02522/FUL. Finally at last the application is received and at the April Parish Council meeting the vote was to continue to support the plans for removal as per the results of the resident's consultation. This was a split decision. It is recognised there are two very distinct camps on this subject. This application will be dealt with not by a Planning Officer but by the Control and Development Committee. As part of that process they will also view the pavilions. It is imperative that any member of the public who feels strongly either way about these logs onto the Basingstoke and Deane web site and submits an opinion. www.planning.basingstoke.gov.uk/online-applications. You can also elect to speak at the relevant Development and Control meeting.

Rooksdown Primary School – planning application HCC/2014/0135 (B&DBC ref PLAN/KK/BAE066) has also been received. Rooksdown Parish Council (RPC) objected to the planning application in line with Rooksdown Community Association (RCA). This may seem a strange decision because of the work that has been done to get a school in Rooksdown. The reasons are that firstly, despite consultation, there are still

flat roofs proposed at only a height of 3m and despite the proposed CCTV the risk of roof vandalism etc is high. Even with the overhang and slope that is on the Community Centre successful attempts have been made to get on the roof. The second issue is the lack of drop off areas or a turning circle. Even with only one form initially this will cause local residents issues with parents parking/dropping off on Park Prewett Road, Elder Road, Watertower Way and Hollies Court. In addition no account is made of disruption to buses or the safety aspects of this. Whilst Our County Cllr (Cllr Reid) assures us he will make sure that as the school expands that suitable drop off and turning will be provided there is no guarantee this will occur as it is not included as part of the planning application. In order for RPC and RCA to support the school planning application these 2 items must be addressed to the satisfaction of ourselves and the residents. After discussions with HCC we hope to support an amended application in the near future. Residents are encouraged to log onto the Hampshire County Council web site to see the plans at:

RPC has submitted 3 Local Infrastructure Fund requests that are under consideration at B&DBC:

- 1) Equipment funding for the Community Space in the old hall
- Litter bins, benches and notice boards in the Southern and core areas as needed
- Skatepark on Rooksdown Park as part of the leisure facilities on top of the S106 monies funded facilities – this will require planning permission

Other matters we continue to pursue are the anti-traveller gate in Rooksdown Lane. Funding for this year is confirmed.

Road adoptions, poor quality highway repairs and funding for a Parish Lengthsman (odd jobman).

We also have a planned meeting with Cllr John Izwatt on Manydown.

The next Parish Council meeting is currently scheduled on 2nd June at 7.45pm in the Community Centre. This in fact will be the Parish Council AGM with election of Officers.


