

# HAINIK BEFORE YOU PAIR

Rooksdown Parish Council regularly receives complaints from residents about thoughtless, often illegal parking around the parish. Over recent months there has been an increase in comments about the parking, the blocking of paths and parking by dropped kerb crossing points.

Unfortunately the Parish Council can do nothing formally more than refer the matter to the Police. Informally we have on occasion and will in the future address letters to residents where these issues are a particular problem. If you wish to complain about parking matters please contact the local Police Officer by calling 101. But also think before you park.

As Rooksdown is a residential area roads tend to be narrow and windy, often have traffic calming measures in their design. Extra danger is created when pedestrians have to walk on the road when cars are parked on the footpath or pinch points. Children especially, cannot be seen by oncoming vehicles.

Remember that if you park on the footway, or part of it, or block a dropped kerb, the Police can issue a fixed fine.

We have also had a couple of emergency call outs for the Fire and Rescue Service and fire engines have found it difficult to get through some roads. So, please think before you park.



# Parish Councillor UPDATES

#### Dear Residents

I appreciate that we are now mid February, however, I just wanted to wish all residents a belated but very Happy New Year and hope that 2015 brings you all health and happiness and also further progress on facilities in the parish for all of us:

#### TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT WORKS Park Prewett Road

As most of you will have seen by now, work is well under way on the new 210 place primary school for Rooksdown on the site behind the Community Centre. The plan is for the school to be built in time to open in September 2015 this really is great news for Rooksdown. Plans and information are available at the Community Centre should you wish to know more.

We will give you updates on progress as we move through the year.

#### **PAVILIONS** Park Prewett Road

You will recall that Taylor Wimpey / HCA submitted a planning application in November 2013 for the removal of the four Pavilions on Park Prewett Road. The application has quite a complex planning history and is to be determined by Development Committee. The Parish Council is reliably informed that Taylor Wimpey have now (finally) submitted all the necessary information that should have been included with the original application back in November 2013 so that the Planning Department at Basingstoke & Deane can now at last begin the process to consider the application.

Many of you had expressed concern at the generally poor condition of the Pavilions at the back end of last year, particularly as we move through the winter month. We therefore requested Taylor Wimpey carry out some basic renovation just before Christmas. We have also had discussions with the Planning & Development team at BDBC to understand the enforcement action that could be pursued against Taylor Wimpey should the current planning application for demolition be refused.

We will provide an update just as soon as we have any news with regards to the outcome of the planning application.

#### WESTERN TRIANGLE DEVELOPMENT

The piece of land off Rooksdown Avenue, opposite Vitellius Gardens - the site of the old Bryant Home / Taylor Wimpey Sales office

Construction work for 30 Apartments is well under way on this piece of land. Groundwork preparation is now nearly complete and the area is to be handed back to Taylor Wimpey at the end of February. Taylor Wimpey have already sold many of these flats off plan with the first occupation by residents likely to be before the end of the year.

BARN AREA Park Prewett Road, corner of Pumphouse Way (20 residential units and listed Barn (B1))

Construction work for 20 residential units and the listed Barn is well under way on this piece of land. Once again groundwork preparation is now nearly complete and the area is to be handed back to Taylor Wimpey at the end of February / early March. Taylor Wimpey are expecting first occupation by residents before the end of the year.

#### THE OLD HALL Northbrook Crescent

Taylor Wimpey have carried out some initial work inside the building to help them understand how the structure has been built and how they would execute their construction should the planning application be approved.

Planning discussions are drawing to their final stages and we expect a decision in the next few months.

**RETAIL CORE PHASE 2** Park Prewett Road, opposite the Coop & Costa Coffee site (16 residential units & 2 retail units)

Taylor Wimpey have confirmed that the construction of residential & retail units will be starting in the next few weeks and should be substantially completed by Christmas.

#### PARK PREWETT NORTHERN AREA (David Wilson Homes) The Old Golf Course

Things may appear to have gone quiet regarding the proposed David Wilson Homes development but construction of the first stage of their building programme is expected before the end of 2015. The Parish Council is planning a meeting with David Wilson Homes mid March so will report back with an update as soon as we have had this meeting.

#### **ROAD ADOPTIONS** West & East side of Core Area

The Parish Council has just seen the latest snagging list from HCC with regards to the proposed road adoptions on the West and East Side of the Core Area and understand that Taylor Wimpey is currently working through the list of faults and issues. Taylor Wimpey and HCC are looking to conclude this matter as soon as they can. We will provide update when we have more news.

#### **FURTHER UPDATES**

Last year, the Parish Council submitted a Local Infrastructure Fund application for a grant for much needed street furniture for the development (including seats, benches and bins). We are delighted to confirm that the Parish has been successful in this application and are currently reviewing the best place for location of the seats, benches and bins. We are hoping for installation in the summer months but will provide an update when we have concluded the review.

The Parish Council is working very closely with Taylor Wimpey to ensure they fix the many street lamps across the development which currently do not work (some of which have never worked).

The Parish Council is also working with Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council to have a further general tidy up and regeneration of the pocket parks along Park Prewett Road along with the repair/removal of any damaged trip knee high fencing. This has been delayed by the weather, but you should see some movement with this over the coming weeks and months.

The Parish Council has resolved that Rooksdown is very much in need of a handyman / lengthsman to help with the general upkeep of the parish. Therefore we will shortly be advertising for the position. If you know of anyone who you would consider suitable for circa 10 hours per week then please ask them to contact Lorraine Jeffs – Parish Clerk on 01256 869612 or 077414 72622 or parish.clerk@rooksdown.org.uk.

We have reviewed the Parish Precept to be able to pay for this much needed position which means that there will be a modest increase of circa £4.00 for the year per household. We will look for other ways to fund this in future financial years including whether there is any funding available from Basingstoke and Deane to partially support such a position.

More details explaining this increase in precept can shortly be found on our Parish Council noticeboards and the Parish Council Website.

The Parish Council attended a Safer Neighbourhood meeting at the back end of last year. I was concerned to hear that towards the end of last year there has been a spate of thefts from cars across the development that have been left unlocked and also low level opportunist crimes. Please have a read of the message on the insert from Police Constable Steve Ladhams and Police Community Support Officer Ellen Beardsell. Also, it may be worth registering at www.hampshirealert.co.uk to receive free crime and community information regarding the Rooksdown area.

Thought I would share this with you all to give you advance notice. In January the Parish Council resolved to support the implementation of a 20 mile an hour speed limit across the whole development just after you enter from the A339 or the Aldermaston Road. Please be aware this decision has been taken for the safety of all residents. We all know those cars which regularly speed through the development (and where these cars belong to residents, we know where most of the drivers live). Let me be very clear irresponsible speeding

around the development will not be tolerated and any such vehicle is likely to be caught on speed cameras which will soon be used at various locations around the parish. Any one exceeding the speed limit is likely to incur a fine and at least 3 points on their license. The Parish Council thank the Police for the support they currently provide in enforcing the current 30 mile an hour speed limit & will be providing to enforce this new speed limit.

Finally ... I think from all the feedback we had, the Rooksdown Fireworks display back on November 2014 was a resounding success. Thanks to you all for supporting it.

RPC has already resolved to hold a Fireworks display in 2015. Can you help? For this year's event to happen we really need more residents to volunteer to help with the overall planning and to help on the day itself. So, if you want to be involved in the planning or if you think you will have a couple of hours during the day itself to help set up or in the evening during the event, please contact Lorraine Jeffs – Parish Clerk on 01256 869612 or 077414 72622 or parish.clerk@rooksdown.org.uk. Appreciate I am referring to an event in 9 months time, however, we need more help for this event to go ahead.

These are the key highlights. So, as you can see ... lots going on in the parish to make it a better place for us all to live. 
