Welcome to this edition of the Rooksdown Reporter, where we have lots to catch you up on.

But perhaps the most significant is the setting up of a Community Speed Watch group to help embed the 20 miles limit which came into force in June, for the safety & benefit of all Rooksdown residents.



### **HOW IT WORKS**

Details of any vehicle caught exceeding the 20 mile limit will be collected at the time of the alleged offence and then entered onto a police database.

The registered owner of the vehicle will then be sent a letter telling them that their vehicle was seen exceeding the speed limit, how it affects the local community and asking them not to do so in the future. If the same registration number is logged again within 12 months the owner's details will be passed onto Roads Policing, who may take further action.

Irresponsible speeding around the Rooksdown will no longer be tolerated.

Please be considerate to the Community Speed Watch volunteers - they are taking on this voluntary activity to positively contribute to the safety and quality of life of everyone in our Parish and they should be applauded for doing so.

# ROOKSDOWN FIREWORKS

The Parish Council has made the difficult decision not to hold a Fireworks event this year.

Rooksdown Parish Council regularly receives complaints from residents about thoughtless, often illegal parking around the parish. Over recent months there has been an increase in comments about the parking, the blocking of paths and parking by dropped kerb crossing points.

If you wish to complain about parking matters please contact the local Police Officer by calling 101.

As Rooksdown is a residential area roads tend to be narrow and windy, often have traffic calming measures in their design. Extra danger is created when pedestrians have to walk on the road when cars are parked on the footpath or pinch points. Children especially, cannot be seen by oncoming vehicles. Remember that if you park on the footway, or part of it, or block a dropped kerb, the Police can issue a fixed fine.

**SO, PLEASE THINK BEFORE YOU PARK!** 



B&DBC provides a weekly waste collection. Bins should be placed on the edge of your property by 7am on your collection day and be left out until 8pm of that day, at the point nearest to the public highway. This could be at the end of your own path or driveway or at the end of a communal path or driveway, at the place where it joins the public highway (the pavement or roadway).

Please ensure you have your house number on your bin so that the contractors can return it to where it was left after it has been emptied.

After your bin has been emptied please take it in as soon as possible and store it securely on your property.

Given the layout of most of Rooksdown, we have asked Basingstoke & Deane to remove bins that are regularly left causing obstruction to pedestrians and resident parking.

We would like to remind all residents to clean up after their dog and themselves!

There has been an increase in litter and dog mess being left around the streets, paths and public green spaces.

More litter bins are being installed shortly and everyone is reminded that all bins can be used for dog mess. There are no excuses!
