You will probably have noticed that a contractor has started the installation of the much needed street furniture (bins, benches and notice boards) around the development following our successful Local Infrastructure Fund application last year. Completion is expected by the end of March.

The Parish Council has worked very hard with the Borough Council to get them to undertake a much needed regeneration of the green spaces which fall within their responsibility (including the pocket parks on Park Prewett Road). You should soon start to see a big improvement in these areas during March which will set us up nicely for the Spring. This is in addition to the great work that is being done by our Parish Handyman, Sebastian Wild, who started at the back end of last year.

The road works on the A340 / Lodge Junction are progressing well. As you know they form part of a much bigger plan to reduce rat-running through Rooksdown. Thank you for your continued patience during this time. Additionally, the Parish Council have been monitoring car speeds through Rooksdown ... See the results of this overleaf in the Speed Watch update.

Finally, you are asked to feed your views into the consultation to shape the proposed Manydown development. It is really important to have your say on things which will impact Rooksdown (like traffic, schools, country park access, pedestrian and cycle access). Early results show that more than 80% of all traffic is exceeding the 20mph speed limit putting driver safety and the safety of residents at risk and it is clear that a significant number are actually residents on the estate.
