## Borough Councillor UPDATE



Deane Borough Council to launch "Kiddie Cones"

Parking measures and support from parents have now greatly improved the safety of children at drop off and pick up time outside the school. Not forgetting a great assembly with Basil Bird around walking, scooting, cycling, road safety and cleaner air quality.

These much need road traffic improvements become increasingly important with the current consultation around doubling the size of the school. One consultation event has already taken place but plans will be available to see at Rooksdown Christmas Fair.

Building on the scheme to protecting students at the school we were also able to implement double yellow lines to protect junctions along Park Prewett Road and bus stop cages to keep spaces clear.

In the next few months a consultation will start on the best way to keep the on road parking spaces that are left clear for residents, visitors and others.

Some options that are possible for these on street parking spaces include a residents permit scheme, restricted 2 hour parking between 9am and 6pm amongst others. All options will be discussed at parish council meetings.



It seems like a long time since the masterplan for the park was discussed with residents at the summer fair in 2014 but it I am pleased that the skatepark has finally had planning permission approved. This has been funded by an application from the parish council for funding from Basingstoke & Deane and I'm sure we will see work on site starting soon.



After much media coverage regarding Rooksdown & Beggarwood Surgeries, they have been one practice since their merger in August 2017, I continue to encourage anyone who has a complaint to send that through to the Clinical Commissioning Group on nhccq.complaints@nhs.net or by calling 01256 705507.

I have had complaints that I have sent through to the CCG resolved in a timely manner and have heard anecdotal reports that service levels are gradually improving. Let's hope it continues on this path.

When I have met with the CCG they continue to tell me that, despite the problems that have been articulated by residents to me, the number of complaints they have received have been relatively low.

An accurate picture of the current situation at the surgery can only be formed if patients let the CCG know about problems or concerns that they have had. The CCG do want to know. 
