



With the nights drawing in it seems a long time ago that we were all enjoying an unusually long and hot summer. One of the delights of autumn is how Rooksdown comes out in force as a community for Halloween.

It was a pleasure to see so many people joining in this year, both young and old, to ensure everyone had both a good time and stayed safe.



The shorter nights remind me that so much has changed in such a short time with the school extension well underway, David Wilson Homes continuing to build, Design Your Own Home and Barratt starting on their sites. What this can mean for existing residents is disruption due to construction traffic. These sites have been no exception with myself and the Parish Council working with the developers and Homes England to get them keep within the terms of their planning permissions. Part of this is to ensure the right delivery gets to the right site following the right route. With this in mind Homes England have agreed to implement a complete consortium signage system and I am hoping this will be implemented imminently.

# MANYDOWN

In a rapidly growing community such as Rooksdown, one of the main jobs of the Parish Council is commenting on planning applications. Last year we dealt with 15, ranging from simple house extensions to major housing developments.

One the biggest planning applications affecting Rooksdown at the moment concerns the 3200 houses being planned for the Manydown development to the south. For us, the most important aspect is the new junction between the A339 and Rooksdown Avenue and how this affects access to Rooksdown. During the formal consultation in September the Parish Council objected to the current proposals because:

- The new double roundabout will make cycle and walking across the junction very difficult
- The southbound access onto the junction from Rooksdown Avenue will be increased from 2 to four lanes. This seems unnecessary for the number of vehicles and will result in an unacceptable loss of trees, vegetation, greenspace and walking space between the current junction and the houses.



We await the Manydown Project Team's response.

## WINTER WEATHER



Whilst we've not yet had any snow we don't know if it is far away. Especially for the new residents and as a reminder this is what is available within the residential areas.

- # HCC gritting routes you can look these routes up on the HCC web-site.
  - a. The whole length of Rooksdown Avenue up to the roundabout with Park Prewett Road is covered as a priority route covered by the large salting vehicles because it is a primary bus route. Please do NOT leave your vehicles parked on Rooksdown Avenue in the event of snow because apart from likely damage you reduce the effectiveness of the gritting. As it becomes adopted then the gritting route will be extended to the next available suitable turning point.
  - b. Community gritting route from Rooksdown Avenue via Gillies Drive to Saxon Wood School. This route is covered by a small community vehicle after any support work on the main trunk routes is completed and subject to driver availability.
- 2) HCC Grit Bins
  - a. These are the large blue ones and they contain grit not rocksalt. These are the responsibility of HCC to replenish and contact details are contained within them to arrange replenishment. There is a strict policy as to where these can be sited. At present there are 6 on site.
- 3) Rooksdown Parish Council Facilities
- a RPC has 19 green and yellow bins doted around the estate primarily in unadopted areas but with formal permission of the land owners. There are some in other areas that do not fit the HCC criteria but nethertheless are in risky areas. As areas get adopted then the plan is to get HCC to replace our bins with their bins and the RPC bins moved to other areas.
- **b**. Some facts on these bins:
  - i. they each hold 300kg of rock salt ie 12 bags each = 180 bags = 4.5 tonnes for a full replenishment.
  - ii. RPC hold a small local store in the Parish for urgent bin replenishment but please note this is undertaken by RPC members with RPC members own vehicles so please bear with us. It is very heavy work.
  - iii. We also have 3 manual gritting machines also held at the centre for use by RPC members. We did not get much chance to fine tune the use of these last year so will need some more work on settings etc.
- 4) General comments
- a. All grit/salt supplied by either HCC or RPC is to be used on public highways and footpaths NOT private driveways or private car parking areas.
- b. Warning letters will be issued if abuse occurs and if abuse continues then bins will be locked out of use. This is in line with HCC guidelines.
