WHO ARE ROOKSDOWN PARISH COUNCIL?





ROOKSDOWN PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT 2023/24

The Parish Council has put together its budget and precept (the money you pay to the Parish Council as part of your Council Tax bill which is shown as 'Rooksdown' on your bill) for Rooksdown in 2023 – 2024.

The good news is that the Parish Council resolved to make no change to the amount which residents pay to what was paid last year and, indeed, we have not increased the precept since 2015.

We want to ensure that Rooksdown Parish Council projects and activities are making the best use of existing funds, without needing to pass on costs to residents.

SAFETY AND POLICING IN ROOKSDOWN

The Parish Council have been engaging with local police, Borough and County Councillors, and other stakeholders, to contribute to the ongoing management of crime and antisocial behaviour in the area.

CAR MEETS

Following a number of reported car-meets around the Borough, Hampshire Constabulary and Basingstoke Police organised a meeting at Rooksdown Community Centre on the 8th December 2022. This public meeting was to bring people together to hear more details of dangerous driving incidents on local roads particularly by those attending 'car meets' and what action we can all take to support enforcement action.

The reports received from you, the residents, are vital in helping officers to conduct investigations and patrols as well as preventing crime. Some information shared by the residents helped officers to tackle unauthorised car meets and resulted in the seizure of three vehicles a few days later. Since December Basingstoke has enjoyed a reduction in unauthorised car meets, although it is possible they may return.

If you witness any dangerous driving or serious Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) relating to unauthorised car meets, **please quote OP CHROMIUM** when you contact the Police. Following your report, you may be sent a link in order for you to upload any footage you might have especially if this includes registration plates.

Please see new updated reporting guide that includes a QR code that will hopefully make it easier to report incidents.

SERIOUS ASSAULTS

In January there were two serious assaults, one on Highpath Way and the other on Blackmoor Drive. This is a concerning matter for residents, and Rooksdown Parish Council have been in close contact with the police and Borough Councillors about the issue.

As this is an active investigation, the police are not able to give a statement about the case. However, police officers have conducted a number of enquiries and are now asking the public for any information that may help the investigation. Police are interested to hear from anyone who has CCTV, ring doorbell, or dashcam footage that could be of assistance. Please phone 101 with reference 44230027011. Alternatively, you can call Crimestoppers 100% anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Following reported incidents, police have increased additional patrols in Rooksdown, and the beat officers have been conducting some specific patrols and engagement in Rooksdown where necessary. As part of the routine 'Beat Surgery', PCSOs Page and Doherty spent Saturday 18th February morning listening to some of your concerns, suggestions, and recommendations.

Your local intelligence is very valuable for our officers for crime prevention and safeguarding of the community. Please continue to report anti-social behaviour or any crimes through standard channels and feel free to contact us if we can assist you in any way. If you have any information, no matter how small or insignificant it may seem to please get in touch by calling 101 or report online at

The Parish Council have spent time identifying street lights where the lights are low or not working, and have reported this to Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council who are able to address this where the lights are the responsibility of BDBC. Unfortunately, Barratt Homes still operate street lights in the newer development area including around Blackmoor Drive, so we are chasing Barratt Homes for action on these street lights.

We will continue to chase up improvements to street lighting. If you are aware of any street lights which are not working, or where the light is too low, please email parish.clerk@rooksdown.org.uk so we can pick this up. Please also share any security concerns that you would like us to explore.





Can we remind all residents to clean up after their dogs and themselves?

PLANNING MATTERS AFFECTING ROOKSDOWN

As we all know, Rooksdown has been so much a focus for housing development in recent years, and one result is that very little land (if any) is left in the Parish to build on. However, developer interest continues in the greenfield sites around our Parish borders.

Manydown will potentially be the borough's largest new housing development. The site extends to meet Rooksdown to the south of the A339 Kingsclere Road – between the Roman Road (Rooksdown Avenue) roundabout & Rooksdown Lane.

Manydown North area

Outline planning permission was granted for the whole north Manydown site in December 2021, for up to 3,520 homes plus mixed used development, local facilities, amenities, schools; also a 100 hectare Country Park.

It is often called out that 'no houses have been built on Manydown yet'. It seem that progress is in the form of two planning applications for construction access – to the Roman Way in Worting (23/00033/FUL) and to the Roman Road in Winklebury (23/00032/FUL). Both applications, as would be expected, have attracted objections and if approved will bring traffic to the Avenue roundabout.

Permission to develop north Manydown is already granted and the site will need construction access.

It is largely because of the delays in building out Manydown that Basingstoke & Deane is under-delivering on its planned allocation of new homes. This is the backdrop to the current planning application for 350 new homes at **Kiln Farm** on the western edge of Popley and a further planning application for c250 homes on **Weybrook Golf Course**, which is expected imminently.

Land at Kiln Farm (23/00205/OUT January 2023) - The BDBC website has so far received over 350 public objections to this application, which is not allocated for housing in the current Local Plan. Decision makers will be mindful of the public opposition and scrutiny. However a decision must be taken according to Planning Policy, both local and national. The case officer will make a recommendation, and the decision will be taken by the borough council's Development Control Committee.

Weybrook Golf Course – This site is also not allocated in the Local Plan. Last November, Bewley Homes staged a public exhibition and 'community engagement' event which it will use in support of its proposals. You can read the Parish Council feedback to Bewley Homes on our website. Once this application is published on the <u>BDBC website</u> it would be helpful if all Rooksdown residents could respond to the consultation and make your views known directly.

HOW TO RESPOND TO PLANNING APPLICATIONS

There is helpful guidance on that website as to how to use the site.

If you support or oppose either application and would like to register your input on the BDBC planning portal, please detail what benefits you think it will bring, or benefits you would like to see, and please raise any concerns. Local input is very important but must relate to planning issues.

You may wish to consider local infrastructure and road safety; impact on landscape and trees; provision of, or the effect on, local amenity; the importance of local access to the countryside and green space; impact on the public footpath and local views. Specific detail, local knowledge and individual experience in relation to the points you raise are valuable.

MAKING ROOKSDOWN A GREAT, SAFE PLACE TO LIVE ...

GUARD RAIL FENCING

The Parish Council is committed to making Rooksdown a great, safe place to live.

You may have noticed that the Rooksdown Parish Council guard rail fencing replacement project is nearing completion.

Much of the existing wooden guard rail fencing around Rooksdown has been in place for around 10 years and is broken, rotten and unsightly, with risk of injury to passers-by and users of the open spaces.

The Parish Council successfully applied for grant funding from Basingstoke & Deane's Local Infrastructure Fund to replace around 1500m of the wooden guard rail fencing with a powder coated steel guard rail solution.

This will reduce ongoing maintenance costs, discourage nuisance parking and illegal encroachment.



We're pleased that the work has been carried out by ROCON Contractors Ltd who are based locally in Bramley and the fencing itself is manufactured by the British Company, Fabrikat, chosen for quality, to look attractive and enhance the overall locality.

Thanks to Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council for their financial support & to the Parish Councillors past and present who have been involved in progressing this project.

WHITE BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS

The Parish Council has also been working with Hampshire County Council to improve the lighting on the White Bridge over the A339 from Rooksdown in to Winklebury as part of our commitment to making it safer.

One of the lamp post columns has been relocated and an additional column has been installed at the foot of the footpath to improve overall lighting in the area. This work has already been a significant improvement.

The final part of the project will be to install a section of illuminated LED handrail on the pedestrian ramp from the base to the top of steps and it won't be long before this is completed.

We appreciate the support of County Councillor Arun Mummalaneni with regards to this project.

QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY

As part of the Jubilee celebrations last year, the Parish Council secured funding to participate in the Queen's Green Canopy, a project designed to see a million trees planted. We have been exploring viable locations for this project, and are making arrangements to plant a variety of trees outside the Community Centre, which will provide colour and shade through the year. We are excited to see how this unfolds, and will update in the next edition of the Rooksdown Reporter.

CONSERVATION GROUP LITTER PICK ON 16 APRIL

We have had a number of residents expressing their interest to take part in future litter-picking and conservation events around Rooksdown. We are currently working with the Borough Council to set up a Conservation Group for Rooksdown and Sherborne Fields.

YOUR HEALTH IN RENTED ACCOMMODATION -CONDENSATION AND MOULD

If you're worried about condensation or mould in your rented accommodation, Housing Standards team can help regardless of whether there is a social or private landlord.

If the landlord has not rectified the hazards after being notified by their tenant, the Housing Standards team can investigate and arrange an inspection of the property to assess the risk to the occupants. If the team determines that there is a serious risk to health present, they have a range of enforcement options open to them to compel the landlord to make the property safe.

You can report any concerns to the team by emailing <a href="https://en.aps.com/en.aps.c information, if possible:

- Your name, address and contact details
- · Name and address of the landlord
- Any photographs of the issues
